SCHOLARSHIP INFORMATION

THE SCHOLARSHIP- valued from \$2500 to \$5000 is to assist AWPA pilots, who aspire to work in the aviation sector, with CPL Navigation training costs.

SCHOLARSHIP CRITERIA:

1. Applicant must be an Australian citizen, a permanent resident or reside in Australia
2. Applicant must be a financial AWPA member at time of application and maintain membership for the duration of the scholarship
3. Applicant must have PPL or RPL with Navigation and CTA endorsements
4. Applicant must hold a current CASA Medical Certificate (Class 1 or Class 2 as a minimum)

SUPPORTING DOCUMENTATION:

- All scholarship applications must include the following items:
- Your essay – Explain how the proposed training aligns with your professional aviation ambitions
- Describe how you demonstrate your commitment to encouraging and inspiring other women pilots or aspiring pilots- both through AWPA and other venues
- Please limit essay to a maximum of 500 words and refrain for sending other items not requested (eg photos)
- Signed copies of references from two flying referees
- Proof of Australian Address (e.g. driving licence/ utility bill)
- Copy of your CASA pilot's licence
- Copy of current CASA Class 1 or Class 2 Medical Certificate
- Copy of last 2 pages of your Log Book (both sides of the last two pages of your open log book)
- Copies of 7 CASA CPL exam passes
- Evidence of Australian Citizenship, Permanent residency or Australian residential address

SCHOLARSHIP CONDITIONS:

1. Candidate may already be undertaking CPL training but only those invoices for navigation training taken after the application closing date will be considered for the Scholarship
2. Scholarship monies will be paid on presentation of invoices or validated receipts to Scholarship coordinator, providing AWPAs membership has been maintained.
3. Scholarship funds may either be paid directly to a Part 141 or 142 Flight Training Operator, or the applicant may have scholarships funds reimbursed to them if proof of payment to a Part 141 or 142 Flight Training Operator is provided.
4. Scholarship monies are to be used by the recipient within 12 months, failure to do so without the written permission of the committee may result in forfeiture of the Scholarship

SUBMISSION OF APPLICATIONS:

Applications are to be submitted electronically via the website.

Closure date: **31st of January 2027**

Note: Late applications will not be accepted.
